- Enter burning or contaminated buildings, structures and other areas to fight fires and/or perform rescues while wearing required clothing and safety equipment. (self-contained breathing apparatus).
- Provides first aid, performs CPR and applies automatic defibrillation to persons requiring these
- Drives/operates fire apparatus.
- Performs clean up of site, firefighting apparatus and equipment as well as areas of the fire station.
- Conducts salvage and overhaul operations.
- Lays and connects hose lines, nozzles and other related appliances. Connects hose to fire hydrants, Fire Department connections, and turns off and on.

- Operates portable pumps as assigned.
- Operates elevating devices as assigned.
- Carries, erects and climbs ladders.
- Operates rescue equipment, both heavy hydraulic and hand tools.
